Reminders:

- 1. Distribute materials to your students as soon as possible to inform parents/guardians. Consider having a "Parents Night" to answer any questions they may have and to work our club logistics. Be sure to receive your school's approval of this activity by completing all forms, which are REQUIRED.
- 2. Each club will be allotted **20** student slots. Others will be placed on a waiting list. If additional slots are needed, advisors will be informed of space availability *based on the timely receipt of registration forms* by each club.
- 3. All students attending camp must complete ALL FORMS <u>unless he/she attended the Ecology Camp</u> 2007. Medical information forms filled out at that time will be used at Spring Camp. All advisors and adult members, including chaperones, only need to complete the registration and individual liability form, <u>unless he/she did not attend Ecology Camp 2007</u>. These are to be turned in with all registration forms.

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GUIDELINES FOR STUDENT BEHAVIOR WHILE PARTICIPATING IN SPRING CAMP 2008

- 1. Students who participate in the High School Hikers Program are expected to observe regulations set forth by the advisors and chaperones and in their respective school's student handbook.
- 2. The rules of common courtesy must be followed in order to have harmonious relationships during the camp:
 - Students will show consideration for others regarding personal property and privacy, undue noise during late hours, and the overall well being of the group. They will exercise the highest standard of conduct in order to reflect favorably upon themselves, their fellow campers, and their schools.
 - Students should not use improper language or be excessively boisterous and rowdy.
- 3. Chaperones play an important role in providing security, guidance, and coordination.
 - Students must realize that is the duty of the chaperone to see that all rules and regulations are carried out and cooperate with them in this regard.
 - Students are to be courteous to all chaperones. Disrespect or insubordination will not be tolerated.
- 4. It is essential that students understand that rules regarding camping arrangements must be made so that the entire group may be accommodated.
 - Students will not leave the campsite at any time without permission of the chaperone. No student may travel away from the group alone at anytime.
 - There will be absolutely no coed visitations in tents at any time during camp.
 - Students must be in their assigned sleeping quarters by the end of the evening (lights out)
 - Students must not change tent assignments unless arrangements are made with the chaperone.
- 5. Students are prohibited from engaging in the following activities:
 - Possessing or consuming cigarettes, other tobacco products, alcohol, marijuana, or other illicit drugs.
 - Smoking or gambling.
 - Driving a vehicle at anytime without the permission of the chaperone.
 - Borrowing money from other students or chaperones.
- 6. Participation and punctuality are very important. Students are required to participate in all scheduled activities. Tents will be off limits during these times unless excused because of illness.
- 7. Friends or relatives may call for students and be responsible for their return <u>only</u> if arrangements have been made prior to departure for camp. Requests must be in writing and signed by parents.
- 8. Any illness is to be reported immediately to a chaperone.
- 9. **Do not bring valuables and/or large sums of money to camp.** The High School Hikers Program will not be responsible for lost or stolen items.
- 10. No visitors will be allowed—only registered Spring Camp participants, guests, and resource speakers.
- 11. Flagrant and/or frequent disregard for the rules by a student will necessitate a call to parents or guardians and an immediate return home at student's/parents' expense.

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SPRING CAMP 2008 CAMP PAUMALU FEBRUARY 9-10, 2008 INDIVIDUAL LIABILTY FORM

Acknowledgment of Outing Member Responsibility, Express Assumption of Risk, and Release of Liability

I understand that during my participation in the Sierra Club High School Hikers Spring Camp 2008, on February 9-10, 2008 at Camp Paumalu in Pupukea and nearby areas, I may be exposed to a variety of hazards and risks, foreseen or unforeseen, which are inherent in each Outing and cannot be eliminated without destroying the unique character of the Outing. These inherent risks include, but are not limited to, the dangers of serious personal injury, property damage, and death ("Injuries and Damages") from exposure to the hazards of travel and the Sierra Club has not tried to contradict or minimize my understanding of these risks. I know that Injuries and Damages can occur by natural causes or activities of other persons, animals, trip members, trip leaders and assistants or third parties, either as a result of negligence or because of other reasons. I understand that risks of such Injuries and Damages are involved in adventure travel such as Sierra Club High School Hikers Outings and I appreciate that I may have to exercise extra care for my own person and for others around me in the face of such hazards. I further understand that on this Outing there may not be rescue or medical facilities or expertise necessary to deal with the Injuries and Damages to which I may be exposed.

In consideration for my acceptance as a participant on these Outings, and the services and amenities to be provided by the Sierra Club High School Hikers in connection with the Outings, I confirm my understanding that:

- I have read any rules and conditions applicable to the Outing made available to me; I will pay any costs and fees for the Outing; and I acknowledge my participation is at the discretion of the leader.
- The Outing officially begins and ends at the location(s) designated by the Sierra Club High School Hikers. The Outing does not include carpooling, transportation, or transit to and from the Outing, and I am personally responsible for all risks associated with this travel. This does not apply to transportation provided by the Sierra Club High School Hikers during the Outing.
- If I decide to leave early and not to complete the Outing as planned, I assume all risks inherent in my decision to leave and waive all liability against the Sierra Club arising from that decision. Likewise, if the leader has concluded the Outing, and I decide to go forward without the leader, I assume all risks inherent in my decision to go forward and waive all liability against the Sierra Club arising from that decision.
- This Agreement is intended to be as broad and inclusive as is permitted by law. If any provision or any part of any provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid or legally unenforceable for any reason, the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby and shall remain valid and fully enforceable.
- To the fullest extent allowed by law, I agree to WAIVE, DISCHARGE CLAIMS, AND RELEASE FROM LIABILITY the Sierra Club, its officers, directors, employees, agents, and leaders from any and all liability on account of, or in any way resulting from Injuries and Damages, even if caused by negligence of the Sierra Club its officers, directors, employees, agents, and leaders, in any way connected with this Outing. I further agree to HOLD HARMLESS the Sierra Club, its officers, directors, employees, agents, and leaders from any claims, damages, injuries or losses caused by my own negligence while a participant on the outing. I understand and intend that this assumption of risk and release is binding upon my heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, and includes any minors accompanying me on the Outing.
- I have read this document in its entirety and I freely and voluntarily assume all risks of such Injuries and Damages and notwithstanding such risks, I agree to participate in the Outing.




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SPRING CAMP 2008 STATEMENT CONCERNING SWIMMING BY PARTICIPANT
